An art deco gem in New Plymouth is restored to its former glory by a pair of dedicated DIY decorators

hen you live in a heritage listed home, care and consideration must go into a new paint job. Jane Dubbelt and Pete Walker have lived in their 1930s art deco house in New Plymouth for 27 years. 20 years after their last paint job, they turned to the same line of Resene paint to refurbish the home.
