How can we be more brave with colour in our home?

The first thing to do when adding colour to your home is to decide whether it should be a new paint colour for the walls or a new bedspread or textured throw. Maybe you have a favourite artwork that you can pull an accent colour from? Whatever you decide, make sure you link the colour to other parts of your home.

What colour paint should we use to add warmth to a room?

Use nature's palette of earthy midtones, such as ochre, burnt amber, cobalt and raw sienna as your wall colour. Try painting a wall behind the bed as a feature to experiment with some unexpected combinations.



Colour clashing is a fashion trend, does it work with interiors?

Yes, don't be afraid to clash your colours and mix warm and cool tones to achieve some beautifully uplifting contrasts. Try coral with soft blue, which is like a winter sunrise, or caramel with mint for a fresh take on autumn.

We are obsessed with wearing black, how does this translate to interiors?

You can be brave with paint and go dark. Black is actually considered a warm colour and can create a dramatic, moody feel to your space. Black can be beautiful in bedrooms with crisp white joinery and in living spaces that have ample natural light. Add texture and warmth by layering with luxurious-looking bedding, faux fur throws and cushions in tactile fabrics, such as velvet.

Is metallic paint a trend this season?
