Resene art with Mark Rayner - 66

You will need:

- Artists' canvas
- Paintbrushes
- Resene Art Action glaze (gloss)
- Resene Art Action Quick Dry
- Resene testpot of Resene Surfs Up



Step one

Apply one coat of Resene Quick Dry to the canvas and allow two hours to dry.



Step two

Apply one coat of Resene Surfs Up to the canvas, allowing two hours to dry.



Step three

Apply a second coat of Resene Surfs Up to the canvas. Again, allow two hours to dry.



Step four

Apply one coat of Resene Art Action glaze to the canvas, allowing two hours to dry.



Step five

Apply a generous dab of Resene Art Action glaze to the back of a button, as shown.



Step six

Carefully position the button on the canvas.



Step seven

Repeat steps five and six, gradually building up rows of coloured buttons, as shown.



Step eight

Continue to apply buttons until the canvas is covered and fill any gaps with smaller buttons. Allow two hours to dry.





To get the look:

Mark painted the background wall with Resene SpaceCote Flat tinted to Resene Chaos.



Other ideas:

Create a cool modern artwork by painting the canvas with two coats of Resene All Black and then stick on metal washers and shiny panel pins with Resene Art Action glaze.
