

★★★ Difficulty level ★easy ★★moderate ★★★challenging Resene kids art with Mark Rayner – 100



### You will need:

- Cat shaped wooden bookends (ours came from 'Spotlight')
- Paintbrushes (including an artists' brush)
- PVA glue
- Resene Art Action Quick Dry
- Resene testpots in the following colours: Resene Alabaster, Resene Black, Resene Bowie, Resene Get Reddy and Resene Tangerine



#### Step one

Following the manufacturer's instructions, assemble the bookends and fix with PVA glue. Allow the glue to dry.



#### Step two

Apply one coat of Resene Quick Dry to the bookends and allow two hours to dry.



#### Step three

Paint the cat shape on each bookend with two coats of Resene Tangerine, allowing two hours for each coat to dry.



#### Step four

Paint cat eye shapes on each bookend with Resene Alabaster, and once this is dry, paint the centre of each eye with Resene Bowie. Allow two hours to dry.



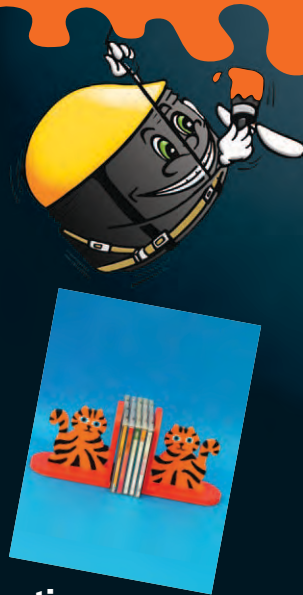
#### Step five

Paint stripes and face details, as shown, with Resene Black. Allow two hours to dry.



#### Step six

Paint the base and side of each bookend with two coats of Resene Get Reddy, allowing two hours for each coat to dry. That's tiger-tastic!



### Top tip:

To create a shiny finish, simply apply one coat of Resene Art Action glaze (gloss) after the paint has dried.



### Here's another idea:
