Resene kids art with Mark Rayner – 113



You will need:

- Paintbrushes
- Plywood cut-out of a cat (ours came from 'Spotlight')
- PVA glue

- Small cardboard box with lid
- Resene Art Action Quick Dry
- Resene testpots of Resene Mariner and Resene Trinidad



Step one

Glue the cat cut-out to the lid of the box with PVA glue and allow to dry.



Step two

Apply one coat of Resene Quick Dry to the box and cat shape and allow to dry for two hours.



Step three

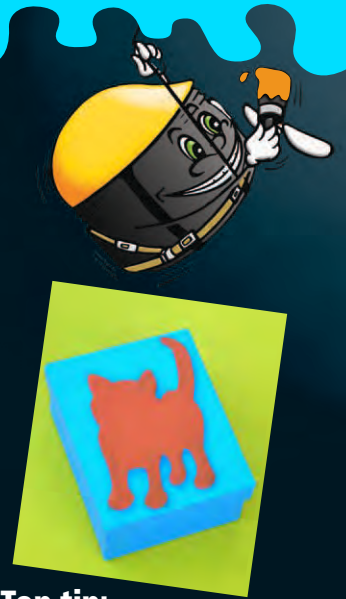
Apply two coats of Resene Mariner to the box, painting around the cat shape, as shown. Allow two hours for each coat to dry.



Step four

Paint the cat with two coats of Resene Trinidad and allow to dry. That's so cool!

It's easy to create this cool cat box for all your little treasures using a cardboard box and a few Resene testpots.



Top tip:

If you don't have a plywood cat, simply draw your own shape on a piece of cardboard and it cut out with scissors.
