Resene kids art with Mark Rayner – 17



You will need:

- Paintbrush
- Resene Quick Dry Acrylic Primer Undercoat
- Small wooden box
- Resene testpots in the following colours: Resene Blue Bell, Resene Havoc and Resene Lavender



Step one

Prime the wooden box with one coat of Resene Quick Dry Acrylic Primer Undercoat. Allow to dry.



Step two

Paint the front, back, side and top panels with two coats of Resene Lavender – allow at least two hours to dry between coats.



Step three

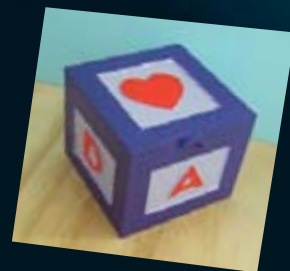
Paint the inside of the box and outer edges with two coats of Resene Blue Bell – allow at least two hours to dry between coats.



Step four

Paint the top heart and side letters with two coats of Resene Havoc – allow at least two hours to dry between coats. Once it's dry, use your box to store all your secret stuff.

A few Resene testpots are all it takes to transform a simple wooden box.



Top tip:

Inexpensive wooden boxes like this can be bought at craft shops.



Here's another idea:

Use Art Action Metallics to create a different effect – here we used Resene Time Warp and Resene Nitro.
