Resene kids art with Mark Rayner – 77



You will need:

- Cotton thread
- Paintbrush
- Piece of thick cardboard
- Resene Quick Dry water-borne primer undercoat
- Resene Testpots of Resene Bright Spark, Resene Hi Jinx and Resene Snap
- Scissors



Step one

Paint the cardboard with one coat of Resene Quick Dry and allow to dry for two hours.



Step two

Paint the cardboard with two coats of Resene Snap, allowing two hours for each coat to dry.



Step three

Cut a piece of thread approximately 50cm long and carefully dip it into the testpot of Resene Bright Spark. Carefully pull the thread out of the testpot and lay it onto the cardboard in a curly pattern, as shown. Repeat until you have five or six of these 'snail trails'.



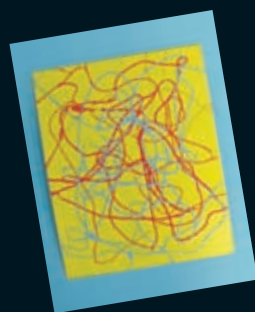
Step four

Repeat step three using Resene Hi Jinx and allow the paint two hours to dry. What a wiggly work of art!



Top tip:

To make wider wiggles use lengths of string or thick wool.
